- The school will make sure it follows all laws and regulations linked to Child Protection and Welfare and will cooperate with all legal authorities if needed.
- The Statement says that the school will have safe practices set up that will reduce the chance of harm or accident to children and staff
- If there is a child protection matter it will be dealt with confidentially.
- All staff in the school will be Garda vetted and the school will follow all vetting laws and processes linked to Government and will follow all vetting guidelines from Dept of Education

- All staff will be encouraged to do training in this area and will be given a copy of this Child Safeguarding Statement, new staff also.
- Any reporting to Tusla will be done by following the guidelines in the 2017 "Child Protection and Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools"
- The first point of contact in the school about any matters linked with this statement is the "DLP", means Designated Liaison Person, and that's Eimear O'Rourke. There are 2 deputy DLPs: Eugene Doyle and Elizabeth McCafferty.
